- The 1st edition of H&V was for January 2000.
- All copies ever issued are archived at Hampshire Record Office in Winchester.
- On a monthly basis **1,240** magazines are published ten times a year. St Mary Bourne gets **710** copies, **330** go to Longparish and **200** are for Hurstbourne Priors.
- You can buy additional copies in the Village Shop and the local churches for £1.
- Hill & Valley can also be viewed on line on websites for the three parishes.

Main Content

- **Church** - Vicar's page and Services in the four Parish Churches
- **Parish Council** - Meeting reports, planning updates and information relating to parish council initiatives.
- **Charities and Community Organisations** - mainly the **Church**, the **Village Halls**, the **Village Shops** and **Village Schools**, but also regular columns, local events, fundraisers, projects, environmental issues etc.
- **Regular Events** - the Community Library, the Repair Café, Coffee at the George, The Film, The Lunch,
- **Annual Events** - Flower Show, Bourne fest, Appeals, etc.

Anyone can submit a contribution on a monthly basis as long as it is in the **communities' interest**.

Contributions need to be sent to the relevant parish editor by the copy deadline (usually the 3rd Wednesday of each month).

The team then compiles and proofs front page, church page, services page, diary dates page and the community pages. The final version of the magazine is sent off to the printers the following Sunday.

On the following Friday one of our volunteers will collect all magazines for distribution and a small armada of volunteers will then deliver the magazine free to each household in the three parishes.
