The Queen's Platinum Jubilee 2nd to 5th June 2022

Dear Friends,

This month we shall celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of HM Queen Elizabeth II. The Queen has ruled for longer than any other Monarch in British history, born in 1926, she is 96 years old, and for 70 of those years she has served our nation faithfully. The special bank holiday from 2nd to 5th June this year will perhaps be the nation's biggest ever thank you party!

Loved in these islands and throughout the commonwealth and beyond, the Queen's commitment of service has been magnificently fulfilled. Over these seventy years she has shown and modelled resilience, strength in difficult times, especially these last few years she has been a constant stabilizing factor for us all. I believe that during her tenure, she has seen 14 prime ministers and 7 Archbishops come and go. She has been an inspiration to all of us, her sense of duty has inspired many to become key workers and volunteers and to serve their country.

As Supreme Governor of the Church of England and also the head of state, one of the Queen's titles is Defender of the Faith. In the sovereign's annual Christmas Day message, the Queen has constantly talked about her own faith in Jesus Christ, and the values and virtues she lives by. In the year 2000 she said Christ's life and teaching 'provide a framework in which I try to lead my life', in 2014 she said her faith was 'the anchor in my life', and 2020 'the teachings of Christ have served as my inner light, as has the sense of purpose we can find in coming together to worship'.

The teachings of Christ, as he said himself, can be summed up in two Old Testament commandments, love God and love your neighbour as yourself. Jesus explicitly taught that we must treat other people as we would like to be treated and not to judge others; even more he said love your enemies and pray for them. His teachings profoundly impact our attitudes to the 'other' in such a way that our broken world today would benefit so much from the healing balm of the Gospel of Jesus Christ that Her Majesty and many others subscribe to.

We continue to pray now as always for our Queen, for her work and for her needs.

ANDOVER TREES UNITED – TIMBERSHARE



Calling all woodcrafting novices who enjoy working outdoors

Award-winning environmental charity, Andover Trees United (ATU) are teaming up with accomplished wood-workers and skilled carpenters to lead a series of funded workshops

for their 'Timbershare' woodland workshops, in June and July 2022.

Funded by the National Lottery and IKEA, participants from the local community will use "leftover" Larch and Cedar from Andover Trees timber-frame cabin project and Ash from their 'One Ash' project which taught school children about the journey of wood from tree to finished 'product'.

According to the <u>Wood Recyclers Association</u> it is estimated that at least 600,000 tonnes of UK waste wood is unprocessed and is at risk of being landfilled annually and wood rotting in landfill creates methane which contributes to global warming. So rather than waste our wood we use it.

We aim to inspire the next generation of foresters, carpenters and wood-workers as well as enabling a restful, creative, outdoor natural woodland environment.

The first series of Timbershare events will take place at Harmony Woods, Andover (SP11 6XU) from 10am to 3pm on the 4, 11, 18 and 25 June (all Saturdays).

On Sunday 26 June there is a Pole Lathe demonstration and workshop.





Annual Parish Assembly 2022 Chairman's Report

Before getting to the work of the parish council I would like to make the usual thank you to all of those who in one way or another are involved in the many activities that take place within the parish. The many clubs that are run on a regular basis, friends of the school, supporters of the Church and Village Centre and of course the many volunteers that give their time to the shop.

As for the work of the parish council, I'd like to take you through some of the on-going projects and activities that we have been involved with during the last year or so.

Highways: As has been the case over the last year or so, HCC has reduced its funding for new signage, street furniture etc. and set has up a system for Community Funded Initiatives. What this means is that they will help with the feasibility and construction of any improvements that we want to make, but the pc has to find the money to pay for them. A number of improvements have already been implemented over the last couple of years, but there are some still outstanding, such as the speed indicator devices. The clearing of grips and ditches continues to be carried out as part of our Lengthsman budget. Thankfully it looks like the Lengthsman scheme is being continued by HCC for this year at least and the parish council is also getting extra revenue from this as Ben our clerk continues to be the administrator for the 14 parishes included in our cluster.

I also want to mention the problems that are still plaguing the residents of Spring Hill who are not able to have their waste bins emptied due to the B&D waste lorries not being able to access the development because of the camber of the access road. There appears to be no easy solution to this problem and what has been suggested in the interim (to continue with the private waste collection that is currently happening, but for B&D to pick up the cost) is not acceptable to them. Cllr Carr has been very active in liaising with all concerned to try and get a workable solution and I thank him on behalf of the residents and near neighbours for his continuing efforts.

Grounds Maintenance: The parish council oversee the maintenance of the Recreation Ground, Lake and War Memorial etc. Scofell Commercial Landscapes who have looked after our grounds maintenance work for the last three years has had their contract extended for a further two years. Premier Grounds and Garden Maintenance will continue to carry out the Parish Lengthsman work.

Our footpaths are generally in a good state of repair, but if you come across any problems with paths being blocked or damage to stiles and signs, please make Ben aware so that they can be dealt with.

Flood & Emergency Group: The recently completed riverbank restoration work alongside the lake should help the flow during times of high water. I would like to thank the residents along this stretch of the Bourne who gave their consent and co-operation for the work that took place on their side of the river. Thankfully this completes the remedial work identified by the Hampshire C.C. Pathfinder Project which was undertaken following the flooding down the valley during the winter or 2013/14. The combination of which has made a big difference towards preventing flooding from the river. The only issues we have experienced in recent years are ground water infiltration into the main sewer, which we have discussed with Southern Water on several occasions to try and find a solution. Thankfully the rainfall was such that this problem did not occur during last winter!

Lake and Recreation Ground: The Lake committee continues with its aims of actively managing the lake environs for the parish in particular to promote habitat enrichment and the Hants & IOW Wildlife Trust and the Wessex Chalk Stream & Rivers Trust continue to support the committee in developing a management plan to meet these objectives.

Last year the Recreation Committee co-opted two parents of children who regularly use the play area to look at updating the equipment and also the feasibility of relocating the play area to a safer location. The two co-optees, Laura Davis and Amelda de Segundo, have carried out a lot of preparatory work and they have been advising on their progress in the Hill & Valley and elsewhere. I'd like to thank them for the efforts so far and hopefully they will be able to make better progress this year as things such as grant availability get back to some sort of normality.

Village Shop: As I'm sure we are all aware by now, there are plans to increase the size of the shop in order to incorporate a cafe area. The Parish Council own the land that the shop is on, but not the building and we are currently in discussions with the shop committee regarding updating the lease to incorporate the changes that are planned. I think everyone wishes the project well and hope that it will be a great success and an asset to the community. The only thing currently standing in the way of this is the need to raise the funds to pay for it which is estimated to be £250,000. It is hoped to achieve this mainly by a Share Offer Scheme and there are brochures available explaining how it will work. There is also a lot of information on the shop website.

Finance and the Precept: I feel there may be some questions regarding the increase in the precept for this year so I will try and deal with that now. This has been done reluctantly in order to slow the reduction in our reserves, so we do not fall below the reserve threshold generally accepted to be required to ensure continuity of service. The parish council's aim is to cover our core running costs with controllable income. Since 2012 those core running costs have increased 25%, compared to an increase in general inflation of 20% and so the increase this year goes some way towards catching up.

We have undertaken some significant projects in the last year or two, particularly the flood prevention work as described earlier and whilst these projects are principally funded by grants, there is always an element of contribution required by the council. This has driven the aim to fund core costs to ensure that reserves are available to meet these contributions.

The parish council has also renewed its grounds maintenance contract for the next two years from 1 April and as you will appreciate, grounds maintenance represents a significant proportion of the core running costs.

I hope that has gone some way to explaining the need for the increase in the precept which at 14.4% appears to be a big jump, but in real terms it relates to approximately $\pounds 6$ for the year out of a total rate increase, in my case, of $\pounds 60$.

Platinum Jubilee in June: There is lots planned for the bank holiday weekend and Karen Crofts has put together an updated report for publication in the May issue of the Hill & Valley

And finally, a few thank yous. Firstly, to our Borough and County Councillors for their work on your behalf and the support they continue to give to the parish council. I would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to Alan Marsden and Tony Grunsell who sadly passed away since our last Annual Parish meeting. They were both long standing members of the pc with Alan also being chairman for a number of years. They were good friends to this village and are greatly missed by all.

In closing I would like to thank all of your parish councillors and also Ben as Clerk for the support they've given to me over the past year and for giving their time, effort and dedication in trying to keep our parish the special place that it is.



These days there are plenty of plastic recycling opportunities locally. These shops are investing a lot of money into

recycling specific items which reduces the sorting needed. Some of the plastic items below are unavoidable at the moment. Do remember that all recycling uses huge amounts of energy so do consider alternatives to plastic as much as possible. What about bamboo toothbrushes from Love+Joy container free shop at Weyhill Fair and take lots of containers for her amazing choice of dried food and cleaning liquids?

Otherwise, New Street Dental Practice recycle all **dental products** so you can give them toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes and caps, flossing sticks, electric brush heads, dental



floss containers and plastic packaging under the terracycle scheme. Drop them off any time between 8.30am and 8pm. Boots will also take dental products.

Leightons in the Chantry Centre take **soft contact lenses** and their blister packs for terracycle sponsored by Acuvue. They cannot take glasses or hard contact lenses. Specsavers, Vision Express and Boots Opticians take old **glasses** and work with charities which provide sight care in developing countries. Superdrug have restarted collecting empty **medicine blister packs**. There is a box at the back on the pharmacy counter. If you are still using disposable **razors** and blades, they can be recycled by registering on the Gillette website for a post-free return envelope. Go

to www.gillette.co.uk/recycle.list .



This is proving very popular so envelopes are taking about 4 weeks to arrive, but you can start collecting now! Breaking news! There is a new tetra pack bin with the recycling containers in Tesco's car park to augment the George yard one and Pets at Home have started collecting empty, clean plastic animal food pouches (for those who have fussy pets) in a large green wheely bin inside the door. These are sent off for a special high heat process which makes an oil of the aluminium and plastic so they can be separated for reuse.

Hurstbourne Priors to Tufton; all had crossings most evenings to their local fishing lakes. Toad patrol was invited to St Mary Bourne School to tell the children all about our efforts. They were a very enthusiastic audience!

The St Mary Bourne Repair Café runs on the first Saturday of each month in The George Inn. (However, due to the Jubilee celebrations on 4th June the next date is Saturday 2nd July).

The café runs from 10am until 12pm. Bring your broken items or clothes to mend and we'll help save them from landfill.

New Chalk Stream Challenge badge for youth groups

The chalk streams that meander across Hampshire are among its most precious ecological gems. Found almost nowhere else on Earth, these waters give hope to many vulnerable species. But with threats mounting and the future uncertain, our chalk streams will need champions for years to come.

Luckily there is a new way to teach young people about this, thanks to two brilliant volunteers from the Watercress and Winterbournes scheme. Hazel and Sarah have used their experience with youth groups to design the Chalk Stream Challenge - a set of outdoor activities focused on wildlife, habitats, and heritage.

The challenge is suitable for Scouts, Guides, or similar groups, and can be customised for different ages. It combines pre-tested routes along local streams with opportunities for learning and exploration. Group leaders can run the challenge at no cost or reward their members with special fabric badges for a small fee.

A range of resources are available, including fun facts, route maps, spotter guides, challenge activities, and completion certificates. Group leaders also have the option of expanding the challenge with a river dipping session from Wessex Rivers Trust, where groups can learn more about chalk stream wildlife.

There are several challenge routes to choose from, all 'offroad' but close to public transport, and parking, as well as places to find refreshments and toilet facilities. The ones currently available are based in Alresford, Whitchurch, and Andover, but the activities can easily be adapted to other local chalk streams.

The PC reviewed and approved the Financial Regulations and Risk Assessment. The Standing Orders require further review and will be presented for approval at the June meeting. The Council also made its annual declaration of continuing eligibility to exercise the General Power of Competence.

Period for public speaking

A member of the public expressed disappointment in the results of the recent renovation of the village stocks. Following years of decay, and an accident with a car, as much of the previous stocks that could be salvaged have been retained. Distinguishable new wood has been added, and the stocks have been set in metal feet and raised from the ground to prevent rot. The resident feels that they are now too high off the ground. The Council agreed to take a look, and discuss at the next meeting. The PC received thanks from LCPL for a grant towards the purchase of new chairs at the River Room in The Plough, and as the residents attending had been unable to attend the Annual Parish Meeting, they also wished to thank the Parish Council generally for their "good humour" and willingness to serve the parish over the previous year.

Finance



The Plough has got off to a great start and word is spreading about our lovely community pub. But there is still so much to do so a new community shares offer has been launched to raise funds for phase two of

the refurbishment.

Improvements are planned for the pub kitchen, gardens, community facilities and parking area. Significant support for these plans is already coming from Test Valley Borough Council, Hampshire County Council, the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (LEADER) and Longparish Parish Council who, between them, have awarded grants totalling £94,000! However, most of these grants are conditional on raising 'match funding' and require the works to be completed by the end of this year.



LONGPARISH WILDLIFE By Chris Bowman

A late April walk...the dog and I start from home, down the back path a jackdaw is on Linda's chimney where it has a nest. The house sparrows are rather quiet at Arthur's; too busy eating the peanuts. We turn left at the shop, not much about only a robin and a few more jackdaws and pheasant in the field on my right. Turning right into the Cleeves a wren is singing deep in the undergrowth and on past the mill a heron is down river; I can just see its head, a chiffchaff is singing on its usual dead tree. There are a lot of blackcaps singing this morning and I spot a pair on my left. The long-tailed tits are busy feeding their young; I have found six nests this year.

On to the bench seat a little **egret** flies by and lands in a tree and there are five **sedge warblers** in the reeds. There is a **coot** upriver and a pair of **canada geese**. On to the crossroads we turn right. A **linnet** is sat on the wire and a **chaffinch** in the tree in front of me. A pair of **stock doves** fly over and a **red kite**.



On to the farm a **pied wagtail** on the roof and a couple of **collared doves**. At the lake the **swan** is still sitting (she has since hatched eight **cygnets**), a **moorhen**, **little grebe** and a **carrion crow**. Carrying on a small flock of **house martins** is catching insects overhead. A **woodpigeon** flies out

from the ivy and a **blackbird** in the field also a pair of **red-legged partridges** and a **magpie**. Turning right on to the bridge a couple of **goldfinches** are having a drink and there are **mallards**, **graylag geese** and a pair of **gadwall**. Carrying on to the trout farm a **dunnock** is on the road in front of me. At the trout farm are **herring**, **greater** and **lesser black-backed gulls**, **tufted duck**, **coot**, **mistle** and **song thrush**, **grey wagtail**, **egyptian goose** and a pair of **swallows** skimming over the water. Turn right on to the bridge and a **goldcrest** is in the tree in front of me and a **great tit**. On we go and a **buzzard** is soaring high above me, a **greenfinch** is sitting in a beech tree and a **blue tit** in the hedge. Turn right only a few **rooks** in the pony paddock and a couple of **starlings** flying over. Back to the shop and home. I hope you have enjoyed our walk we saw **49** different birds.

Saw my first house martin on 19th April, 8 days later than last year, swift on 29th April (2 days later) cuckoo on 3rd May (7 days later).


